Jesus brings light in a dark place

Our outreach at Lyell and Sherman can be interesting for sure. Although we are there at midday, Lyell Avenue is one of the darkest places in the city. The neighborhood has the dubious distinction of having the highest rate of prostitution in the region. It is also a hub for drug dealing, attracting people from distant locations in upstate New York.

STILL, AMID darkness, Jesus brings forth light. "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life" (John 8:12). This story shares the love of a man who walks in His light.

It was around noon and the servants were actively being fishers of men. They were across the street *Continued on Page 4*

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where small groups of people often gather between a grocery store and a bus stop. On that day, four men were standing by the bus stop. Two servants invited them to the outreach and offered prayers.

A STOIC older gentleman wearing a red jacket stood there unresponsive. A dear brother came over to me and said: "We were unable to talk with the man wearing the red jacket. But, there is something about him... look at him... He stands there motionless, listening to the word. He needs Jesus."

I often walk the streets with this brother and feel blessed witnessing his gift of evangelism and his discernment. As I watched the motionless "man in red," the Lord put in my heart to walk across the street and approach him.

I GENTLY introduced myself and the ministry and invited him to join us. His gaze remained fixated and he continued to be motionless. Running the risk of being obtrusive, I persevered.

The man in red finally opened up,

saying: "I just can't..." I let him know that if he did not want to miss the bus, we could bring food to him along with encouraging literature about our living God. He was grateful but said politely: "I don't need food. I am being fed by the word."

I noticed that his chin started to quiver and offered to pray for him. He became more comfortable and shared the following:

"I AM on my way to a mental institution to be with my beautiful wife. She has a severe case of paranoid schizophrenia and needs to live there. I catch the bus every day to be with her but my heart breaks when I see her in that state. Even though it's painful for me I will be there. Some people say that is my obligation as a husband. They just don't understand... (pause). This is not about an obligation. This is about my ETERNAL love for my wife. Jesus will never forsake her and neither will I."

I have done my best to remember

his words but still cannot do them justice. It is also impossible using mere words to communicate this man's emotion and love. I realized then that his unresponsiveness to my brothers had nothing to do with rejection or indifference. The word spoken by Pastor Russ was melding the love of Jesus and the love for his wife in his heart.

GROCERIES? A hot meal? Clothing? Fellowship? Tracts? All nice things but *nothing* compared to what was inside the heart of the man in red.

We prayed. We hugged. Tears flowed from our eyes. The bus came and the man in red lovingly said goodbye. I walked across the street trying to wipe tears from my eyes. My discerning brother, whom God used to trigger my meeting with the man in red, hugged me, saying nothing. He did not know the details but somehow he sensed what had just happened.

A MAN'S love and devotion for Jesus and for his wife was presented to me in ways no Christian marriage seminar or Bible study could ever do. God speaks through the city and I thank Him for allowing me to receive His message of love. Lord Jesus, we ask that You bless the man in red during his difficult but godly journey and that You bring healing to his wife.

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; that he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish. So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth loveth his wife himself" (Ephesians 5:25-28).
